Watershed Planning Video:

George presented a video prepared by NYSDOS concerning watershed planning. (Of note: Dave Zorn of Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council was one of the speakers in the video).

TMDLs:

Steve Lewandowski, Lake Ontario Coastal Initiative (LOCI), gave an update of the Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) analysis/project for phosphorus in Black Creek. The project is fully funded, via Recovery Act money, and is moving forward using the AV-GWLF model (Arc View-Generalized Watershed Loading Function). They are also using the State of the Basin Report for land use information. They would like to collaborate with the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council to acquire additional land use information. George Squires volunteered to send Steve the information he has regarding cropland in the watershed.

Watershed Planning Update:

A selection committee has been formed from the Project Advisory Committee (PAC). Selection criterion will be developed from the method used to choose the State of the Basin (SOB) consultant. Further information to follow.
